CHAMBLEE HOLDS ANNUAL FIREWORKS AND CONCERT AT KESWICK PARK

June 21, 2019— Don't miss an evening of music, fun, games and, of course, fireworks! The City of Chamblee will once again host the Fourth of July Celebration at Keswick Park on Thursday evening, July 4th.

This family-friendly event will begin at 5:00 p.m. with activities including a bike parade from Chamblee Middle School, bounce houses and more. Food also will be available from local Chamblee favorites like the Frosty Caboose, as well as from the Steel City Pops, several food trucks and the nonprofit group Cop-N-Stuff.

Live music will start with Diana Mar at 5:30 p.m. and will end with Crystal Clear Band taking the stage, who will play Motown classics to current chart-toppers. They will play until the fireworks display begins around 9:30 p.m. Parking is available at Chamblee Middle, or you can get some fresh air as you walk along the Rail Trail to the park.
